ANALYSIS REPORTS OF THE COMMUNITY DATA COLLECTION EXERCISE IN EBONYI STATE

Introduction

From the 14th to 15th of December 2018, In line towards achieving the Strengthening, Monitoring, Evaluation and Learning Outcomes for accelerated effort to EndFGM, YNAFGM used the developed electronic Community Data Collection tool which was develop by YNAFGM to be able to capture the responses of stakeholders and other community members in the states of project implementation on questions relating or that are related to the practice of FGM and other social norm in their communities. In the course of the exercise 59 community stakeholders were randomly selected in four communities in Abakiliki and Ebonyi LGAs of Ebonyi State Nigeria and were interviewed using the data collection tool.

Analysing the questionnaires completed by the stakeholders from the data collection exercise conducted in Ebonyi State, the following were pointed out.

FINDINGS

- ✓ 88.1% of the respondent Strongly agreed the FGM is a harmful practice
- ✓ Respondent were still not clear on the side to toll on the issue of people facing condemnation as a result of not undergoing FGM
- ✓ 39% of respondent agreed that they still practice FGM while 37.3 were indifferent on whether it is practiced or not 23.8% said that the practice is no longer in existence this goes a long way to show that the practice is still on going in the communities though might not be compulsory to all.
- ✓ There were a lot of mutilations in the questionnaires'
- ✓ There were a lot of group answers as against the individual opinion sorted which is the major reason for the exercise.

CHALLENGES

- ✓ Inability of some stakeholders to read and understand the questionnaire without the aid of the interpreter
- ✓ Individual meeting of the stakeholders was more expensive

RECOMMENDATIONS

- ✓ The questionnaire should be administered to different stakeholders at different spot to avoid group answers
- ✓ The Questions should be read and interpreted to stakeholders who cannot read or write and also the grading properly interpreted to all participants.
- ✓ There should be more FGM awareness programs and projects in these communities to reduce the number of people who do not want to speak about FGM
- ✓ Media enlightenments and Campaigns in these communities should be done in their local languages.

CONCLUSION

Having accessed the responses from the questionnaires sent back by the stakeholders and having looked at their merits and demerits, the following conclusions suffix.

♣ Since most individual have accepted that FGM is a harmful practice and that no religion supports it, therefore advocating to community and religious leaders with the backing of the relevant government laws will help endFGM as also shown in their responses.
